Membership in the CAHS is open to anyone with an interest in the history of aviation. Our members are to be found in all parts of Canada and in many other countries. They include both those who have been actively involved in aviation and those who share a lasting enthusiasm for this richly varied subject. Among the latter are writers, photographers, artists, model builders and others with similarly specialized interests. You may participate actively or simply enjoy the benefits of being a member of the CAHS.

THE JOURNAL

The quarterly *Journal* of the Canadian Aviation Historical Society is the Society's principal publication. It offers articles dealing with a wide range of subject matter pertaining to the history of aviation. Stories may be first hand accounts by those who have themselves made aviation history, or thoroughly researched articles by dedicated historians. Material is of predominantly Canadian content; many little known facets of Canada's history in the air have been unearthed by *Journal* authors.

The *Journal* is profusely illustrated, often with previously unpublished photographs from both private collections and official sources. Items dealing with historic aircraft may be complemented with superb general-arrangement drawings. *Journal* covers feature works in colour by leading aircraft illustrators as well as rare colour photographs. New members will each receive the four *Journals* for the year in which they join — or for the following year if they wish. Almost all back issues of the *Journal* — published since 1963 — can be obtained by new members.

CAHS GOALS

The **Canadian Aviation Historical Society** is dedicated to furthering an awareness and understanding of Canada's aviation history by:

- encouraging research into the history of aviation, particularly in Canada.
- publishing a *Journal* as a means of recording and disseminating the products of such research.
- recognizing and stimulating interest in the achievements of Canadians in all fields of aviation.
- bringing together those who are deeply interested in the history of aviation with those who have been active participants.

CHAPTER MEETINGS

CAHS chapters are active in Toronto, Ottawa, Vancouver, Regina, Winnipeg, Halifax, Montreal and Fredericton. Members within range of these cities will be welcomed into the local organizations which meet regularly to hear speakers or become involved in other aviation oriented activities. Fellowship is an important aspect of all such functions. Chapter fees are nominal.

NEWSLETTERS

As well as the *Journal*, the CAHS also publishes *Outbound*, a national newsletter presenting topical material beyond the scope of the *Journal* and keeping members abreast of CAHS activities. *Outbound* is distributed to all members.

Several of the Society's chapters also produce newsletters made available to subscribers within their particular areas — and to members elsewhere who may wish to subscribe.

NATIONAL CONVENTIONS

The CAHS holds its National Convention and Annual General Meeting each Spring. Historical papers are presented, the Society's activities are reviewed and directors are elected for the following year.
