#### Tid-Bits from the Secretary

It seems there is always too much to put into one newsletter. Then when it is time to put one together, it's a delicate task of selecting what to put in, without overloading you with 50 pages!

Perhaps the most important things on this year's calendars are our events and speakers for the RCAF 100. We partnered with 250 (Saint John) Wing, RCAFA Association for our prime project, which is to recognize the 70 aviators who died at the RCAF Station Pennfield Ridge. During the war several units of the RCAF and RAF were stationed there. You may not know that Pennfield was the landing site of Captain James Mollison in 1932—the first east to west Trans-Atlantic flight.

Further in the newsletter you will find information about several of these RCAF 100 events. It might surprise you that planning for some of these events began in 2019.

The RCAF Pennfield Ridge Air Force Memorial is a one acre lot of the former air base. It is owned by 250 (Saint John) Wing, RCAFA Inc. There are four members on this not-for-profit Board—two from Turnbull and two from 250 Wing.

All told, we and 250 Wing will be investing about \$300,000 into our projects, with the money raised from various funding sources. Details about Pennfield, our Banner project, and the Group Captain Cole memorial restoration are in this newsletter.

Do you have a personal RCAF 100 project? Please share with us for our next newsletter. If you do not have a project, then maybe you can take a local RCAF Veteran for a coffee and thank him/her for their service.

## RCAF 100 Centennial

There are several events planned by us and our partner 250 (Saint John) Wing, RCAF Association. These will take place at various locations around the Province. Details will be provided over the next few months.

We have asked the City of Saint John, and through the Province, all municipalities in the Province, to have one crosswalk painted in RCAF colours with a Roundel.

**01 April** \*Unveiling of RCAF 100 Banners around the Province.

- Sponsored by Irving Oil Ltd. and Turnbull (NB) Chapter.
- This is a \$50,000 project.

**07 June** \*Dedication of the RCAF 100 Air Force Memorial at Pennfield Ridge.

- 250 (Saint John) Wing, RCAFA Inc. owns one acre of this former air base.
- This is a \$250,000+ project.

**Summer** \*Assisting the City of Moncton for the rededication of their CF 100 Canuck in Centennial Park.

**24-25 August** \*Participate in the Air Show Atlantic, CFB Greenwood.

**4 September** \*85<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the loss of Northrup Delta 673 and the loss of the first two members of the RCAF to die during the Second World War, Juniper

- Sponsored by Turnbull (NB) Chapter and 250 (Saint John) Wing.

**15 September** \*84<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Battle of Britain. Eight New Brunswick pilots participated, of which five were killed in action.

- Sponsored by 250 (Saint John) Wing, RCAFA and Turnbull (NB) Chapter.

**15 October** \*Restoration and re-dedication of the Group Captain W.R. Cole monument at Pineville, NB and visit to the crash site at Mount Winslow.

- Sponsored by Turnbull (NB) Chapter and a private sponsor.



## RCAF 100 Banners

We received funding to print 100 commemorative RCAF 100 banners. These will be displayed throughout the Province for this years centennial of the RCAF.

We have selected 100 nominations for 100 women and men from NB who served between 1924 to 2024.

There were over 50 New Brunswick communities represented by these aviators, and nominations were received from many Provinces and from two US States

Our plan is to display them around the Province from 01 April to 12 November 2024.

We also designed two commemorative banners for 403 and 410 Squadrons, both which received the Freedom of the City of Saint John.

We are discussing with our sponsor and the Lieutenant Governor about having an official kick-off event at Government House on 01 April. Stay tuned for details.

## Our RCAF 100 Banner Aviators

These are the 100 women and men aviators who will receive the RCAF 100 centennial banner. After the banners come down in November, the nominators will be given their banner, compliments of our sponsor, Irving Oil, and our Chapter.

The banners highlight the two Squadron crests of 403 and 410 Squadrons, both with a strong connection with New Brunswick and which have supported our Chapter. The background images are of aircraft flown by these Squadrons and the RCAF.

The information shown is their rank and name, decorations, and their place of birth. If born outside of New Brunswick, it will also include where in NB they spent much of their life.

The banners will be four feet high and are designed to be hung outside or inside a building. The RCAF motto is at the bottom along with the logos and names of the two sponsors, Irving Oil and Turnbull (NB) Chapter.

2024 is also the centennial of Irving Oil.

We have three pre-1924 aviators who served with the Royal Air Force during the First World War. Two of those three continued to serve until the Second World War. Four of our Second World War aviators are still with us and we plan to display their banners in one location.

Our motto is *Per ardua ad astra*, a Latin phrase meaning "through adversity to the stars".

## Joseph "Pepi" DiGiacinto



The Chapter lost one of our distinguished members this past fall. "Pepi" passed on 13 November 2023.

This is his obituary from McAdams Funeral Home in Fredericton.

"The family of Rose-Anne wishes to announce that after 53 years of love, flying, sailing, laughter and adventures Joseph "Pepi" DiGiacinto has departed this world. Pepi was born in Fredericton, NB,

March 31, 1931.

Pepi enjoyed life. His love of flight took him to many places. He flew for Maritime Central Airway where he worked in the north for the Dew line. He worked for his father, Guy, with Fredericton Aviation flying contractual flights within Canada and USA. He was hired by Pan International and Bavaria German in Germany, flew to the Azores, Canary Islands and within Europe. He flew 747 for an American Company then to Saudi Arabian Airlines from which he retired from flying Tristar 1011. He moved back to Fredericton to work in construction and renovation.

Pepi was a member of St. Dunstan's Catholic Church and a member of the Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus. He also belonged to the Turnbull (NB) Chapter of the Canadian Aviation Historical Society.

Pepi is survived by his wife, Rose-Anne Michaud. Also by his sisters, Mary (late William Spurrell) of Mississauga, ON and Nina (late Victor Bober) of Fredericton, NB; nephews, Gordon Spurrell (Sandra) of Mississauga, ON and Kris Bober of Halifax, NS. He leaves several cousins, in-laws and special family, Moreau-Mailhot Gaétan, Nathalie, Jacob and Charlotte.

He was predeceased by his parents, Cavaliere Guy and Adela DiGiacinto.

A special thank you to the staff at Neill Hall where Pepi was for the last 11 months. Your good care and love was always appreciated ... especially his back scratch!

There will be no visitation. Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated from St. Dunstan's Catholic Church on Monday, November 13, 2023 at 12:00 pm with Fr. Suresh as celebrant. He may best be known locally as the pilot who flew our Lancaster into Edmundston in the 1960s.

We will have all items individually sealed before being sealed into the Time Capsule. The items will be exposed to humidity and temperature changes over the next 100 years.

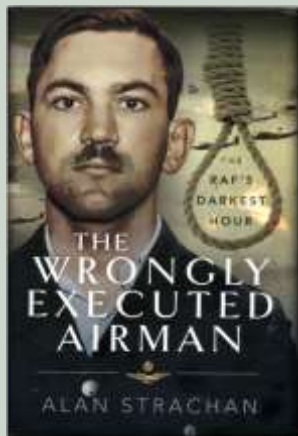

Students at Fundy High and St. George Elementary planted our first 24 trees. We will be planting over 200 trees, consisting of Vimy Ridge English Oak, New Brunswick Spruce, and Canadian Maple.

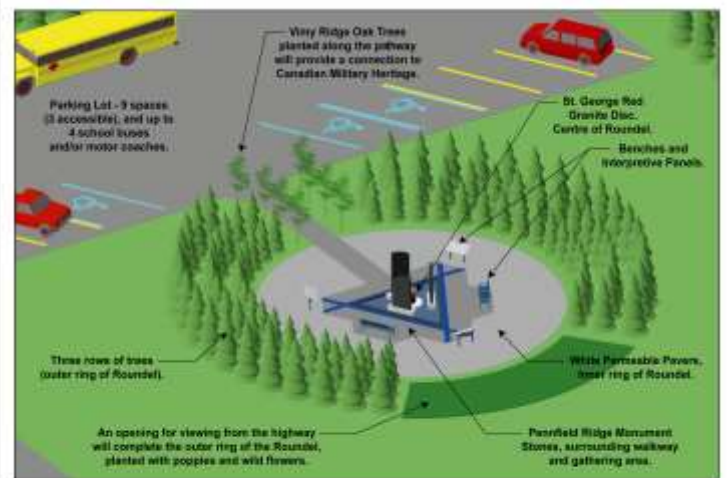

We have been greatly assisted by Lester McKay and Wayne McQuarrie of Pennfield. We have partnered with the Charlotte County ATV Club #40 and with Landscape NB.

The Chapter is a Registered Charity and if you wish to make a personal donation, we would be happy to receive your support. Individuals have donated amounts ranging from \$35, several in the \$2,000+ range to \$35,000.

We will receive about \$4,000 from our GST rebate for last year and will use that as the seed money for the Trust Fund for the Park.
