Late in 2022 our Chapter was made aware of a critical piece of aviation equipment that had been used at #34 S.F.T.S. RAF training base in Medicine Hat, a Wind Vane, aka Wind Tee. Through the City of Medicine Hat Heritage resource Working Group and with the support of four other local historical organizations we have made good progress. In January our chapter brought together the Royal Canadian Legion Branch No. 17, the Royal United Services Institute Medicine Hat, the Historical Society of Medicine hat and District and the Southeast Alberta Archeological Society to form a Wind Vane support group. Over the last several months contact has been made with a number of archivists requesting information on the Wind vane with no results. The City is motivated to preserve and move the equipment to a more prominent location to honor the sacrifices and service of all airmen who trained here. Though some persuasion will be needed. The work continues as we have not lost of enthusiasm for this project.

In late June our chapter will be proposing a supporting event for the Commemorative Air Force who are bring their B-17 and B-25 to Medicine Hat just after the CAHS Conference. More details will be available as they develop.
