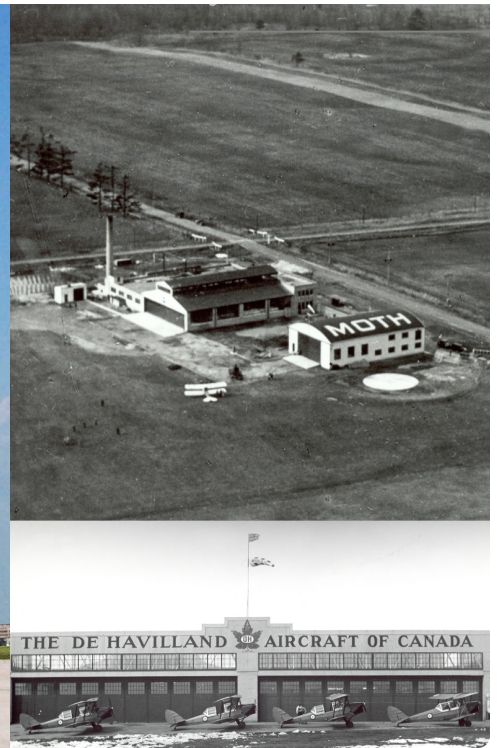

Personal recollections of the Toronto Aerospace Museum and the Avro Arrow Replica

The Toronto Aerospace Museum (TAM) was a non-profit charitable society that developed an exciting educational, heritage and cultural tourism attraction at Downsview Park within the historic factory of The de Havilland Aircraft of Canada Ltd. Founded in 1997, one of the Museum's major achievements was the construction of a full scale replica of the famous Avro Arrow supersonic interceptor.

Claude Sherwood was an engineer at Avro Canada when the Arrow program was cancelled on February 20, 1959 — his 21st birthday. Forty years later, he led a Museum team that constructed a full size replica of the Arrow which rolled out in October 2006.
